Information Gathering – Rawson Farmhouse Property Uses

- No development restriction beyond current zoning
- Learning Laboratory
- Marion Rawson's wishes in transfer to UC Foundation:

"... acceptable development, according to deed records, include: a conference center, a guest house, foundation or administrative headquarters, educational programs or housing."



Information Gathering – Clifton Aesthetics/Quality of Life

- Maintain unique character of the Clifton community:
 - Lawn & Trees Nature/Natural Green
 - Identity of a walkable community
 - Beautiful architecture Home Historic
 - Impact of Traffic/Parking on residential neighborhoods
 - Village green
 - Playground Children
 - Fencing

Information Gathering – *Traffic Ingress/Egress/Parking*

- Traffic!
 - Pick-Up & Drop-Off coordinated with Fairview
 - Staggered starts only extend traffic impact
- Parking!
 - Staff & Visitors How much and where?
 - CRC Lot
- On-Site Driveways/Connections
 - Safety

Information Gathering - Student Indoor/Outdoor Recreation

- Indoor Gym at CRC
- Outdoor Playground & Rec Field
 - Creative/Promote creativity
 - Learning space
 - Engaging nature
- Create pedestrian pattern by & through property
 - Public/Private space separation
 - Safety

- Seek funding necessary to achieve best-possible play area to meet the needs of the school and broader community




Community engagement

Individuals from the community contributed their play area priorities during the Ice Cream Social (Sept. 9)





Current activities of the CANS Advisory Group, Playscape Committee

- Continuing to collect ideas and community input
- Meeting with landscape architects and play area developers, focusing on nature playscapes
- Learning CPS play area safety and materials standards
- Talking with DAAP about running a charret in January to generate planning and design ideas
- Establishing a grants database





Information Gathering – *Hilltop Campus Planning*

- Concentration of community assets
- Value to community greater than the sum of its parts
- School-Day vs. Everyday functions/uses/opportunities
- Infrastructure in support of community needs
 - Functional, Safe, Clean. . .
- Identity/Image of Clifton
