- **II. February Meeting Minutes** (attached) Pres. Brunner moves to adopt, second by Robert Hamberg (U).
- **III.** Treasurer's Report Treasurer Checco: (Report attached)
- IV. Caretaking and Beautification Statistics Treas. Checco with guest Captain. Gregoire/District 5: (Power Point presentation available on request) Peter Block thanks for the records and wonders about relativity to population

density. Robert Hamberg lives on Lowell which is a crime hotspot. Are there any plans for amelioration of the situation? He believes his neighbors have stopped reporting the drug deals because there didn't seem to be a response, so he thinks the reported numbers are low. Capt. Gregoire says there is a plan, and he will contact Robert Hamberg offline to discuss the impressions and nature of the crimes recorded. Brian Duffy asked if there are recommendations about how to best report crime we witness? Capt. Gregoire says an email sent to District 5 will be forwarded to the Sargent. License plates are very important. Drug investigations take time and are often undercover. Arrests are one thing, convictions are another thing, and cases have to be built.

٧. NSP Application Discussion - Pres. Brunner: Presenting more information and the entire community makes a final vote on NSP projects. We have a total of \$7,987 available this year, and we can submit multiple projects. - 1) **CCAC's Wednesdays in the Woods/**Leslie Mooney - concerts at Burnet Woods bandstand multiple weeks, sponsoring for one is \$1,500 Re: masks and social distancing? Signage will be around, and courtesy will be encouraged. 2) Drivein movie night at CRC/Catherine Hamilton Hicks: CCAC is partnering for funds management, projector and organization, College Hill has been a prototype for this, the plan is for 4 films one a week in April 3-24 with any needed rain dates in May. Family-friendly event, 12 volunteers needed and CBA has pledged \$1500, CCF will also be asked for \$1500. The Esquire is supportive and will bring concession items for sale. Screenings will be free, reservations are needed with potentially an ask of a few dollars to reserve, with a coupon good towards popcorn. Local businesses will be promoted on the screen. Sponsorship ask from CTM is for \$1,500 including recognition on social media and flyers to promote the event, recognition at the showing as well as the opportunity to set up an information/membership table at the event. 3) Hiring another Ambassador on Ludlow Avenue to promote public safety for businesses and beyond. Secy Checco and Peter Block present concept. CBA could use our help, 30—40 hrs are presently covered by Hillary Williams on the Plaza. More eyes on the street are a good crime deterrent. Proposing \$12 hourly, up to \$1500 a month for 5 days/5 weeks of service removing graffiti and litter more widely than Hillary can presently do. Targeting \$3 K to pay a second helper for 2 months, respecting the required June 30 funding use date. Nancy Paraskevopoulos thanks for current beautification efforts and asks for more training for the ambassadors – suggests information about Greater Cincy Behavioral Health Services, referrals to housing, something that goes beyond asking for people to move along. Hillary and a new Ambassador would work closely with CBA members and leadership to identify needs. Chris Harding suggests that strategies for reducing homelessness be included in training.

Treas. Checco suggests that, in order to have more than 2 months of paid service, we could have an agreement with CBA to spend whatever CTM can raise, and then CBA picks up subsequent pay periods. Genet Singh suggests that an Ambassador be well trained and that CBA can support this work. At the Market she is having problems with panhandlers, they have had to lock the bathrooms and are limiting use of café table and chairs. Basics and practicalities to insure clean/safe/attractive would be a starting point for assigned work. 4) Buying a radar sign - Kevin Marsh (proposal attached) for an electronic sign and associated software to monitor vehicular speeds costing \$2950 (one sign delivered cost). Pleasant Ridge is already using this kind of sign, DOTE supports its use and our Transportation Committee would manage movement of the sign, to be rotated in permanence. Vehicle counts and their speeds are collected, to be used to support reports we would make to the City. This for prevention, self-awareness, not for arrest. Mark Jeffreys adds that 2 batteries cover about 10 days use. 5) Using the funds for already budgeted **expenditures** - Brian Duffy suggests that one Wednesday in Woods is already in the budget, money needed for the Chronicle is too, whatever is left over can be in the coffers. Malcolm Montgomery is concerned that since we can't raise money from the House Tour in 2021 and maybe not in 2022, we don't have the means to cover things already in our budget. He feels that the business community needs our support the most because it's still in crisis, and spending the money on the Chronicle would be a safe resting spot. Pres. Brunner points out that newsletters can receive a maximum of \$4K. Kevin Marsh points out that our new benches and GoVibrant were past dream projects. The top three can be funded. Results from the poll: Drive in Movie Night \$1500/27 votes, Wednesdays in the Woods \$1500 /26 votes, Traffic Speed Radar Sign \$2950/19 votes, Already budgeted expenditures, specifically the Chronicle/14 votes, Hiring of a public safety ambassador/9 votes.

- VI. NBDIP Pre-Application Discussion Pres. Brunner: The pre-application is due April 1st, which is before our next scheduled meeting. We were just informed today by the City that CTM has an outstanding NBDIP project, the Clifton Facade Program, with funds allocated that will need to be repurposed. President Brunner will update the Board when we have more information, and it may be necessary to call a special Board meeting later in the month.
- VII. Arts and Culture Committee Update Peter Block. On Friday, March 5, 4-8 pm, Rick Malette's "Drawing with Paint" show opens with masks and social distancing. Gallery hours: March 5 April 10, Fridays, 4-8 pm.
- **VIII. Communications Committee** Chris Harding. A CRM showing with a few different companies will be scheduled soon.

- IX. Transportation and Public Safety Update Mark Jeffreys. Vision Zero projects were submitted to the City, DOTE is reviewing our recommendations. The Temporary Bike Lane on Clifton Avenue will have a ribbon cutting on Saturday, March 27 at 10:30 am at Straight St. and Clifton Ave. Volunteers are needed to help put up temporary barriers with City on March 15 or 22, weather depending. Resolution about our support of Vision Zero presented for use by the DeVou Good Foundation that is funding it. Mark Jeffreys moves, seconded by Pres. Brunner (U)
- X. Parks Committee Mark Jeffreys: Dunore Dog Park was proposed in winter 2020, the topic came up again in in the January Park Board meeting and an online survey was offered to the public. All are encouraged to fill it out by March 31. A committee meeting will be scheduled for Ap 1, (anyone can join, ask Mark Jeffreys to include you) and the committee will ask for data to be shared by Park Board. The committee will review the data and come with a resolution to the CTM Board, which will allow for a second chance for discussion. Caroline Miller suggests that a prompt for the survey go out again on the CTM listserve for those who don't do social media. John Osterman wanted to know if other locations are being considered. Mark Jeffreys says the survey only deals with Dunore. Nancy Paraskevopoulos wants to know if Parks has done an environmental impact study. Mark Jeffreys doesn't know, and will check.
- XI. **Housing and Zoning** – Malcolm Montgomery: The city is going to update our boundaries. Two motions attached concern the shared boundaries that Clifton has with Corryville and CUFNA. He moves to accept, Treas. Checco seconds, vote (U). A letter proposed to be sent to City zoning hearing examiner David Sturkey (copy attached) about a Clifton rental property renovation project on Bishop Avenue. The CTM H&Z Committee feels that the review process did not follow best practices. Notification of the review results only came to us after the hearing, so CTM representatives could not attend. Our concern is that the examiner favored testimony that may have misrepresented our position rather than considering our actual position that was already on file. The letter is meant to make the review board aware of this problem, and Malcolm Montgomery moves that we accept the letter and send it, Robert Hamberg seconds. The letter is displayed on screen for review. Treas. Checco says that he (when checking CTM mail) mistook the notification card for a duplication of an earlier hearing for the same address, and so did not communicate the postcard to the H&Z Committee. He feels he is responsible for that glitch in communications,

doesn't feel there was any ill intention by anyone concerned, and if this about procedural issues, he is uncomfortable with accusing anyone of malfeasance. Malcolm Montgomery feels the postcard may never have been sent by the City. Treas. Checco credits the H&Z committee for their hard work and their intentions to be fair and honest, but he feels that the letter needs to be about how we communicate, giving the benefit of the doubt to our neighbors. He would feel more comfortable with a more generic letter about improved process. Mark Jeffreys agrees that the naming of people is problematic, but that we should communicate with the City about our need for inclusion in a reliable process. Ioanna Paraskevopoulos feels that a generic request is more appropriate, and Peter Block agrees with the inclination to not be specific with blaming anyone. Robert Hamberg would have preferred that the letter not be shared at this meeting. He has seen the transcripts from the hearing, and feels that CTM was, in fact, misrepresented. He doesn't want this to be seen as a personal attack but thinks the letter should be sent as originally presented. Treas. Checco still believes this is a problem of failed process and proposes a friendly amendment that a more generic letter be sent. Brian Duffy seconds the amendment. Malcolm Montgomery is reluctant to include names in this kind of communication but was persuaded by the transcript/tape of the testimony that the property owner claimed that CTM had changed its position to not opposing the project. Montgomery has had discussions with all parties involved, and while reluctant, feels the letter should be sent as originally drawn, and so he rejects the amendment. Nancy Paraskevopoulos asks why the decision of the examiner has not been appealed since CTM did not have the possibility to attend the hearing. She wonders what our appeal process is. Robert Hamberg agrees to answer that question by an email. What is the benefit of specifically naming the property owner in the letter? A: The recipient of the letter knows the details. It's about a specific petition, and there's an investigation about whether or not we were sent communications of notification. Vote on amendment of the letter: Y 3, N 4, A 6. Vote on sending of the letter as originally presented: Y 4, N 3, A 6.

XII. Clifton Community Organizations Cooperation report – Treas. Checco: The MOU (attached) defines how CTM will work with CCF for receipt of funds from GCF for specific projects. CTM Exec Committee will review each request and then if agreed will receive the funds and will eventually send back any residue. Treas. Checco moves to adopt this MOU for operation procedures, second Malcolm Montgomery, vote (U)

- XIII. Trustee, Committee and Liaisons Reports: Announcement that the Mosque is opening a second driveway on to Woolper near the top of the hill to relieve congestion. We have recently received plans, H&Z will review and will bring info to the next meeting. Treas. Checco: Finance Committee purchased a mailing list, and also received a gift from CCF of their list. After a lot of work we have a list that is "clean" for Clifton residents. The Uptown Rentals and Gaslight Property businesses have agreed to send the Chronicle electronically to their renters, reducing our printing and mailing costs for 2000 newletters, but with an increase of 2000 readers.

Brief Project Description

Clifton Town Meeting requests NBDIP funds for the creation of a parking lot to support the Clifton Cul Center's plan for a new, 18,000 sq. ft. multi-disciplinary community arts center in Cincinnati's diverse Clifton neighborhood business district. CCAC has an option to purchase a parcel of land at 3412 Clifton Dewey's Pizza to construct a new facility in the business district, and will have a permanent easement adjacent parking lot, accessible from Hosea Avenue. CCAC serves more than 40,000 residents and visit throughout the neighborhoods of Uptown Cincinnati and beyond each year, and with dozens of art experformances and classes, will bring foot traffic to the many restaurants and other small businesses lo Ludlow Avenue.

CCAC is partnering with Emersion Design for A/E services, and has selected Skanska as construction material Skanska and Emersion have completed Design Development drawings and estimates and will comment coordinated review process with the City in the next few weeks. Construction of the parking lot include an existing stone retaining wall and guard rail; regrading; new asphalt; striping of 52 spaces, including spaces; lighting; landscaping; and, new pedestrian access to the adjacent parking lot of the Clifton Unit Church. The total estimated cost of the parking lot is \$375,800. Dewey's and CCAC will share the cost improvements and ongoing operation. 

Request to Neighborhoods of Uptown for Burnet Woods Disc Golf Course Expansion and Upgrade

January 2021

Hello Neighborhoods of Uptown Members,

The Burnett Woods Disc Golf Course expansion and upgrade project is almost ready to go. The Nati Disc Golf Club has reached out to NOU with a request to plug one final funding gap. The current course is 9 holes, has almost no signage, and dirt tee pads that aren't especially distinguishable from the rest of the terrain. It is very difficult to play at the course or even find the first tee without prior knowledge. Unsurprisingly the course sees very little use.


The expansion/upgrade will add 9 new holes to bring the course to 18, a new walkway, much better signage, and new baskets and concrete tee pads. See the attached map for details. The upgraded course should get much more use by area residents and visitors alike. It will provide an excellent recreational activity and bolster our neighborhoods and business districts. It's also a great free and COVID friendly outdoor activity.

The Nati Disc Golf Club's request to NOU is to split the cost of the new baskets (the holes in disc golf). They will cost \$7,000 total. A contribution of \$3,500 from NOU would allow the project to proceed. The disc golf club would handle the purchase and NOU would reimburse them. Here is a list of the upgrades along with the proposed funding sources,

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



Resolution on Dog Park in Dunore Park

For Consideration April 5, 2021 Board Meeting

Whereas in early 2020, the Cincinnati Parks Board of Commissioners and Clifton Town Meeting (CTM) had separate meetings to consider a proposed dog park in Dunore Park; and

Whereas, with the pandemic, this proposal went dormant for a year until January 2021 when in a Cincinnati Parks Board of Commissioners board meeting it was raised again. In February 2021, Cincinnati Parks distributed a survey to gather input into the Dunore Park dog park proposal, a survey that was open for input until March 31, 2021. There were 850 people who responded including 222 people living within 1 block of the park. In the April Cincinnati Parks Board of Commissioners meeting they will consider further action on the proposed dog park in Dunore Park; and

Whereas, the survey conducted by the Cincinnati Parks did not ask whether a dog park in/or around Clifton was desired, but rather whether there was interest for a dog park in a specific location at Dunore Park; and

Whereas the Clifton Town Meeting Parks Committee received the survey results on Thursday, April 1 in the afternoon and held community forum that evening to consider the survey results and gather community input. Cincinnati Parks Commissioner Jim Goetz attended that meeting; and

Whereas, survey results concluded that constructing a dog park in Dunore Park is polarizing: total interest in constructing a dog park was slightly more in favor with 54.6% strongly or somewhat in favor and 45.1% strongly or somewhat against in total. Within 1 block that is 27.9% in favor and 72.1% against, within <10 minute walk, 56.6% in favor and 43.4% against and >10 minute walk 80.7% in favor and 19.3% against; and

Whereas, 46.45% of total respondents said they would use it and 53.55% said they would not use it; 62.2% of those >1 block would use it and 37.8% said they would not; 49.3% <10 minute walk indicated they would use it and 50.7% said they would not; within a block 24% said they would use it and 75.8% said they would not; and

Whereas benefits were seen as a community gathering space, improved safety, using an "underutilized space"; the concerns were loss of greenspace, increased noise, lack of parking, increased litter/smell with a dog park that would need to be maintained; and

Whereas 21.2% of people said they would be willing to help fund the construction of a dog park in Dunore Park while 78.7% said they would not; 20.1% said they would be willing to help maintain it while 79.9% indicated they would not be willing to help maintain it; and

Whereas, there is significant community discussion about alternative sites that would not take away greenspace and where it would be easier to maintain.

Resolved, that the Clifton Town Meeting Board of Trustees does not support the construction of a dog park at Dunore Park given how polarizing this location is and with the potential for other locations without the downsides of loss of greenspace and;


Resolved, that the Clifton Town Meeting Board of Trustees believes there is interest in a dog park in and around Clifton that would not replace greenspace and is well maintained.

Resolved, that the Clifton Town Meeting Board of Trustees requests that the Cincinnati Parks explore several alternative locations for a dog park that do not take away greenspace, and partner with CTM on a community engagement process to gather feedback on those potential sites.





Q1 Where do you live in relation to Dunore Park?




Q4 I would describe my interest in constructing a dog park at Dunore Park as:






Q5 The primary benefits I see in constructing a dog park at Dunore are: (Check all that apply)





Q6 The main concerns I have about the construction of a dog park at Dunore are: (Check all that apply)




Q3 Would you use a dog park in Dunore Park?




Q7 Would you help fund the construction of the dog park?
