### **Motion to Approve Agenda – Ben Pantoja**

The meeting agenda was sent out prior to the meeting. Bridget made a motion to approve the meeting agenda. Barry seconded the motion. The agenda was approved unanimously.

### **Motion to Approve March General Meeting Minutes – Owen Waller**

March Minutes were emailed out to the board prior to the meeting. Owen motioned to approve minutes, Barry seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

### **Fire Report – Captain Eric Horn, Cincinnati Fire Dept.**

Captain Horn provided the number of runs for Engine 34: 192 total runs, 6.19 per day. 87 ALS (Advanced Life Support) runs, 66 BLS (Basic Life Support) runs, 31 fire related runs. 166 of Engine 34's runs were in the Clifton area, 5.35 per day: 82 ALS, 52 BLS, 31 fire.

An audience member asked about smoke detector installation, Captain Horn explained that all services typically associated with fire houses (smoke/CO detectors, baby-seat car installation, etc) had been moved to 311. You can apply for an appointment on the 311 Cincy app.

### **Clifton Recreation Center - Brittany Havens**

Partnering with the Common Orchard Project, the CRC planted fruit trees the past weekend. A shed was donated to CRC to store tools and keep the garden clean. The CRC's Buy-Nothing Swap will be returning this year on April 25th from 10:00 AM to 12:00PM

### **Clifton Branch Library update - Jeanne Strauss de Groote**

Jeanne introduced herself to the audience and announced a few of the upcoming month's programs.

On April 11th from 10am - 12pm, there will be a recycling sorting social to help community members find recycling options in the area and sort clean, dry recyclables.

On April 14th, the library will host a game night from 6:00-7:30.

On April 21st from 4:30-5:30 the library will host a teen summer job information session. Teens can learn common interview questions and get prepared for a summer job.

### **Quarterly Police Update – Officer Dent**

Crime numbers go out with monthly agenda Officer Dent encourages being aware of crime trends. Dent said violent crimes are down and auto theft, mainly Kias and Hyundais, are down but still occurring.

Officer Dent highlighted that he and other officers share as much as possible to the community, but active criminal investigations frequently have sensitive information that cannot be disseminated.

Axon Fusus Connect is the camera integration system from the real-time-crime department. Officers can pull up cameras that are registered to monitor incidents.

An audience member asked whether residential cameras are a one-time permission for CPD to access. Officer Dent clarified that they have to receive permission every time they can access residential cameras.

Officer Dent brought up problems with speeding. He recommended residents report to the police areas with lots of speeding. Dent emphasized that CPD traffic enforcement is a temporary solution to speeding, and using road design (speed bumps, road diets, etc) to prevent speeding would be a possible long term solution.

Dent also mentioned that accidents or pedestrian "close calls" can be reported on the 311 app. Areas with high numbers of reported incidents are more likely to receive traffic interventions.

Jan asked Officer Dent whether the footage CTM submitted to CPD assisted in the Ludlow burglaries investigation. Jan mentioned identifying the car of the suspect. Dent let the board know that there was a correlation between the

subject in the video and the string of burglaries, though they were not able to find the owner of the vehicle.

### **Treasurer's Report – Bridget Waller-Kent**

All transactions for the Chronicle were resolved, the printing house was paid, and the Chronicle account saved \$1480 with the new printing house. The Clifton Plaza camera upgrades were paid for and the cameras have been installed. The event permit for the Memorial Day Parade in Mt Storm has been purchased, and the Off Ludlow Gallery had a successful show without any payment hiccups with their new Point-of-Sale.

Regarding CTM's payment system, Bridget explained that a PayPal specific Point-of-Sale system was chosen and would be utilized for the Memorial Day Parade and Picnic.

### **Committee Reports**

#### **Arts & Culture – *Not currently chaired***

No report this month.

#### **Caretaking/Beautification – Kevin Mohan**

The beautification committee coordinated with the park board to get the first round of flowers planted along Ludlow. Ace Hardware donated bags and tools, and Dave Taylor of Gaslight Properties gave the committee access to the parking lot for pallet storage. Roughly 15 volunteers showed up and the pots were planted successfully.

#### **Chronicle – Jan Checco**

The Spring Chronicle was mailed to everyone in Clifton and dispersed within the business district. Jan said the Chronicle team had a good experience with the new printing house.

#### **Clifton Plan – Gerald Checco**

A Clifton plan update is included later in the agenda.

#### **Clifton Soccer – *Not currently chaired***

No report this month.

### **Communications – Ben Pantoja**

Ben let everyone know the website update was in progress, mostly funded by NSP and grants. The contractor is recreating the CTM website on Squarespace and will teach trustees how to use it once the design is completed.

### **Events – Lindsay Wile**

Barry explained that the permit for the Memorial day Picnic has been filed, the band has been booked, which is the same band from last year but running under a different name: Volume.

He has been filling Lindsay in on the nuts and bolts of the Memorial Day Picnic and everything has been going smoothly. The events committee is looking for volunteers for the Picnic, reach out to [contactctm@cliftoncommunity.org](mailto:contactctm@cliftoncommunity.org) if you are interested.

### **Golf Outing**

No report this month.

### **Governance – Ben Pantoja**

Ben explained he had arrived at a satisfactory wording for a bylaws amendment reducing the board size from 15 to 13. This would be talked about later in the meeting.

### **Housing & Zoning – Owen Waller**

Last meeting the H&Z committee hosted a community meeting with a developer of a new house on McAlpin. Since it is a hillside district the design was scrutinized. Eric Russo from the Hillside trust was hopeful, if done right, it would provide a good example on how to add stability to a hillside while building. The hearing was April 1st.

### **Membership & Nominating – Barry Gee**

CTM only has 12 trustees, more trustees are needed to help the board with its responsibilities.

**Public Safety – Aaron Weiner**

Public safety was covered as an agenda topic.

**Transportation – Bob Seigel**

Both the Transportation committee and the BRT Ad Hoc committee met last month. The transportation committee endorsed the Option 1 BRT stop, and the BRT Ad Hoc committee did not reach a consensus but concluded that the Option 2 BRT stop should not be chosen.

No update on the upcoming Warren speed bump installation- they were scheduled for last Fall but delayed because of snow. The Clifton Avenue bike lane extension is slated for late spring and scheduled to finish early summer.

David Meyer is also working on pitching a redesign of the McAlpin, Clifton, Woolper intersection. The Transportation committee is not currently taking action, but David is pursuing it with DOT.

**Welcome & Connect – *Not currently chaired***

No report this month.

**Neighborhood Support Program (NSP) Liaison – Barry Gee**

Barry checked with Jan about how much NSP money the Chronicle had spent. This was to get aligned for an NSP interim report that is due tomorrow. He is waiting on the city budget to be finalized to get refunded for items that have already been purchased.

**Clifton Business Association Liaison – Jan Checco and Aaron Weiner**

No report for this month.

**Off Ludlow Gallery – Mary Pat Lienhart**

**End of Committee Reports**

### **Paint the Streets on McAlpin – Katie Kalafut**

Katie presented a Cincinnati Paint The Streets application depicting a street mural to go between the CRC, Fairview-Clifton, and CANS on McAlpin Ave. The mural concept was created by Jason Snell, a nationally known graphic artist, and it will be painted by kids during the CRC's Back to School Bash in August. Katie Davis from Keep Cincinnati Beautiful will be coordinating the implementation and laying it out before the Bash. Katie asked CTM for \$100, which will help her team get a Safe and Clean grant. She already has pledges from CANS PTA, Fairview, and many other parents are excited about the idea.

Ben wrote up a resolution to be voted on which commits \$100 to Katie Kalafut's High Five street mural, as a part of Cincinnati's Paint The Streets program. The project has already received DOTE approval and CTM would be providing \$100 out of the total \$750 budget.

Ben made the motion, Jan seconded. The board approved the resolution unanimously. The motion will be attached to the minutes below.

### **Motion for Option 1 for BRT Station – Bob Siegel**

Ben read a resolution to approve the Option 1 BRT station. The full resolution will be attached to the minutes below.

No one on the board had anything to discuss regarding the resolution. Ben made the motion to adopt the resolution. Bob S. seconded the motion. The motion carried 11-1, votes were as follows:

### **Clifton Plan Update – Gerald Checco**

Gerald announced that the Clifton Plan was restarting and, by the end of May, Kyle Gibbs will have a completed Clifton Plan draft to be shared to the community. This will be an opportunity for a large collection of feedback and will shape the final Clifton plan. Community engagement sessions will be held in June (maybe also July) and then CTM will move to adopt the plan.

Kyle is currently meeting with Gerald, Ben, Owen, and Patrick as a working group to finish up a few final goals of the plan.

### **Resolution to change Clifton Cares Safety Fund Donation Description – Bridget Waller-Kent**

Bridget read a resolution regarding the description of the Clifton Cares Safety Fund meant to correct and amend the wording to accurately reflect how funds have been/will be spent. The full resolution is included below. Bridget made a motion to adopt the resolution, Jan seconded.

Trustees emphasized the need to create a way to donate to CTM that was not related to safety, as the Clifton Cares Safety Fund is the only place on the website to donate to CTM.

The board voted unanimously to approve the resolution.

### **Wording of Bylaws Change – Ben Pantoja**

Ben read the wording of the Bylaws change he proposed.

Bridget expressed concerns of limiting the number of trustees who are able to chair committees and volunteer on behalf of CTM. Ben expressed that if every person who ran got a position, CTM could not choose between members with more experience. He also hopes reducing the size will provide CTM with more board members who will be highly involved.

Barry clarified that non-board members can still participate in any committee, and that CTM has more board members than any other community council. Owen expressed that CTM also does a lot compared to other community councils.

Owen continued that he was not, on paper, a qualified candidate and was elected during a non-competitive election. He said he was afforded opportunities, empowered to take on responsibilities, and completed a high volume of work despite being one of the lowest voted.

Ben expressed that a lot of energy is expended trying to fill the board for such a large number of trustees.

Despite debate on the amendment, the board decided the wording was sufficient and reasonable.

### **Community Questions & Concerns – Ben Pantoja**

Peggy Moses, armed with a 311 Cincy posterboard, told the audience about 311 Cincy and how she had used it to remediate issues in the neighborhood. She commented on how fast the service was and how seamless the reporting had been. She urged the audience to use 311 Cincy more for their issues so all Cliftonites could enjoy the higher quality of life that results.

Bob Hyland thanked the board for their commitment to listening to the community and approving the BRT Option 1 resolution. Regarding the bylaws amendment, he expressed concern about the reduction of board members. Specifically, he cited “trained incapacity” or “occupational psychosis” where those with the biggest resumes would be chosen over someone with less experience but more functional skills and unique perspectives.

Glenda Smith introduced herself to the board and audience. She is running for the Hamilton County Court of Common Pleas Judge and wants to prioritize her aptitude, experience, and perspective to get fairness and justice.

An audience member echoed Bob’s sentiment of gratitude for listening to the community. They expressed hope that the board would more thoughtfully frame issues around poverty, citing previous language of “aggressive panhandling” vs just “panhandling.” They said that thoughtfulness regarding people of different income levels could also be applicable with public safety issues.

### **Adjournment - Next CTM Board Meeting 5/4.**

Motion to adjourn called by Jan, seconded by Patrick, and was unanimously approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:16.

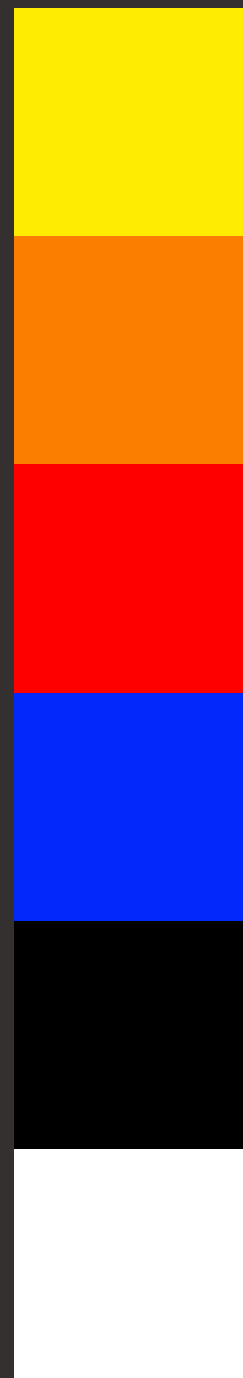

**Motion for Metro BRT locations in Clifton and For Future Enhancements**

Whereas, in 2029, Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) will revolutionize Clifton transportation by providing buses every 10 minutes with limited stops for efficient travel to destinations like downtown, and

Whereas, Metro spent a year working with a CTM ad hoc committee consisting of members of CTM, the Clifton Business Association, and the community to define two possible locations for a BRT station near the Clifton business district, and

Whereas this collaboration led to Option 1 on Ludlow Avenue near Middleton Avenue and Option 2 on Clifton Avenue between Ludlow Avenue and Howell Avenue, and Whereas Metro improved Option 1 over time to at least partially address the concerns of the CTM ad hoc committee, and

Whereas the audience in CTM public engagement meetings on 2/24/26 and 3/2/26 identified many reasons why they largely favored Option 1 over Option 2, and

Whereas choice of the Clifton Business District BRT location is just one of many choices that must be made before the three Clifton BRT stations open for business in 2029,

-----

Therefore, this moves that:

The Board of CTM supports the Option 1 location for the Clifton BRT station eastbound on Ludlow and Ormond and westbound at Ludlow and Middleton, and

- CTM strongly urges Metro and DOTE to preserve these elements of the preliminary design plan for Option 1: limiting platforms to 50 feet long, limiting the height and width of stations above the platform for less visual clutter, eliminating just 3 parking spaces on Ludlow, a median on Clifton Avenue between Ludlow and Howell, eliminating the slip lane at the corner of Clifton and Ludlow, and intelligent BRT interaction with traffic lights for traffic flow and emergency vehicles. The benefits of Option 1 will be reduced if these elements are lost.
- CTM, the BRT Transportation Subcommittee of CTM, the Clifton community, Metro, CPD, the Park Board, and DOTE continue to collaborate on a variety of additional opportunities related to the BRT that are listed below. CTM will enlist the help of the city’s Office of Planning and Public Engagement to plan and execute public engagement sessions on these topics and to integrate public preferences into the Clifton Plan.

**OPPORTUNITIES AND FUTURE DECISIONS RELATED TO THE 3 CLIFTON BRT STATIONS**

- Possible enhancements to the other two BRT stations that will be within Clifton’s boundaries:
  - “Good Sam” BRT station in the center of Clifton Avenue north of Dixmyth:
    - Crosswalks at Howell and Terrace and possible “Hawk” signals for safe pedestrian access to the BRT station

- Some type of “Welcome to Clifton” gateway signage in the median
- Recommend that DOTE agree to Metro’s recommendations for medians between Ludlow and Dixmyth
- Trees to compensate for the loss of trees on Ludlow on the planned medians between Ludlow and Dixmyth
- BRT station at Cincinnati State:
  - Attractive, functional station design
  - Median to enhance pedestrian safety, with trees and some type of “Welcome to Clifton” gateway signage
- Apply CPTED (Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design) principles to all three BRT stations to improve safety and cleanliness.
- Find opportunities to support the “Ludlow Avenue Redesign” concept from the business district through Central Parkway, including possible bike lanes. (This redesign was approved by CTM and DOTE in 2021).
- Optimize the integration of sidewalks and adjacent yards with BRT platforms for safety, maintainability and cleanliness. The design is not straightforward given that the platforms will be 8” higher than a normal sidewalk and that some options to address this may not be desirable because they eliminate more parking spaces
- Design both Ludlow Avenue stations to ensure they harmonize with Clifton’s historic character. This includes developing signage standards to avoid unsightly advertising and oversized branding
- Develop a comprehensive traffic, parking, and delivery plan for the Business District, including considering delivery-only zones.
- Ask Metro for a Maintenance Plan for the Clifton BRT stations that outlines procedures for routine upkeep, litter removal, cleaning, graffiti elimination, and management of other postings
- Develop a plan for strict enforcement of the no loitering code for BRT stations
- Consider ways to maintain bus service to the west side of University of Cincinnati given that the BRT will not travel there and the current plan is to reduce Bus 17 service by 66%.
- Ask Metro for a clear strategy regarding BRT bus transfers and connections to other lines on Ludlow Avenue, focusing on signage, rider convenience, and accessibility.

## **Motion to Determine Future Spend of and Update the Title and Wording of the “Clifton Cares 2025 Safety Fund”**

Whereas, the current wording of the CTM website states:

“Support this crowdfunding campaign to improve our community’s safety through additional police presence. In 2022, CTM partnered with Clifton Business Association and Cincinnati Police Department to provide daily beat shifts on Ludlow Avenue, quieting our streets and helping our neighborhood businesses to thrive. Your donation will fund additional police details throughout 2025.

Costs break down this way: One hour = \$75, Four hour shift = \$300, One week of service = \$1200. Any amount you donate helps us to maintain peace for neighbors, visitors and customers. Clifton Town Meeting is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Thank you for your donation.”

Whereas, CPD does not have the capacity to supply additional police presence and CTM is not currently requesting daily beat shifts

Whereas, the remaining balance in the Clifton Cares 2025 Safety Fund is \$64.16 after updating the Clifton Plaza security cameras and CTM does not currently have a safety project in mind

Whereas, the name “Clifton Cares 2025 Safety Fund” is not clear when shortened to “Clifton Cares Fund”

Therefore, this moves that:

The Board of CTM supports updating the name of the “Clifton Cares 2025 Safety Fund” to “Clifton Safety Fund” and requires that the allocation of the remaining \$64.16 and any future donations will be voted on by the board before use on any new safety projects. Additionally updating the wording of the website to say:

“Any donations to the Clifton Safety Fund will be voted on and spent at the discretion of the current CTM Board of Trustees. In the past we have used donations to fund daily beat shifts from CPD and update the security cameras at the Clifton Plaza. While we do not currently have a safety project to fund, we welcome suggestions from the community and CTM appreciates your donation and commitment to keeping our neighborhood safe”

## 2026 Change in Number of Trustees

- Whereas CTM Bylaws requires 15 board members and other Cincinnati Community Councils are believed to have 11 or fewer board members, and
- Whereas CTM often has multiple vacancies because it is difficult to get 15 volunteers to apply for board positions, and
- Whereas CTM rarely has competitive elections, with no more than enough candidates for all the openings and sometimes fewer candidates than all the openings including in 2025, and
- Whereas CTM currently has only been able to fill 13 of the 15 positions, and
- Whereas there have been ties in past elections for the last remaining open position and the current bylaws provide no provision to address ties,
- Therefore, the following Bylaws amendment will be proposed in the future in 2026 and the Governance Committee and Nominating Committees will need to manage the transition to 13 trustees:

### Original Wording

#### ARTICLE V. BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND BOARD MEETINGS

**1. Number of Trustees.** The management of CTM, its affairs, finances and property shall be entrusted to a Board of 15 Trustees.

**2. Election of Trustees.** On the date of the annual Board meeting, the members of the organization shall elect five Trustees to fill the vacancies created by the expiration of terms, and the Trustees so elected shall serve for a term of three years, or until their successors are elected and qualified. If for any reason more than five three year terms expire in the same year, the five trustees who receive the most votes will serve three year terms. One year or two year terms will be assigned based on number of votes as needed to return to the intended target of five expiring three year terms per year. The members shall also elect Trustees to fill additional vacancies that arise due to trustees leaving office prior to completion of their three year term. Trustees so elected shall serve the length of the unexpired term. No person shall be elected as Trustee by the general membership for more than two full consecutive terms or six years plus any part of an unexpired term served as a result of appointment by the Board of Trustees.

### New Wording

#### ARTICLE V. BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND BOARD MEETINGS

**1. Number of Trustees.** The management of CTM, its affairs, finances and property shall be entrusted to a Board of 13 Trustees.

**2. Election of Trustees.** At the annual Board meeting, the members of the organization shall elect as many trustees as needed to fill vacancies created by the expiration of terms or caused by trustees leaving office prior to completion of their terms.

The number of 3-year terms will follow a fixed pattern aimed at filling thirteen 3-year terms every three years with minimal variation from year to year. This pattern is as follows: If the last two digits of the year the next term will begin are divisible by three (e.g., 2027, 2030, 2033), then the election will need to fill five 3-year terms. Otherwise the election will need to fill four 3-year terms. As a result, every three years of elections will fill  $4 + 4 + 5 = 13$  3-year terms.

The Nominations Committee will then determine the number of 1-year and 2-year terms based on trying to

balance the number of vacancies forecasted for the two elections following the current election. The 3-year, 2-year, and 1-year terms will be assigned based on descending order of the number of votes.

Ties have occurred in past elections creating confusion about which candidate will be rewarded with, for example, the last 2 year term. Ties will be decided by the highest roll of dice rather than requiring the audience to revote on the tied candidates.
