Motion to Approve Agenda – Ben Pantoja

The meeting agenda was sent out prior to the meeting. Jan made a motion to approve the meeting agenda. Patrick seconded the motion. The agenda was approved unanimously.

Motion to Approve January Meeting Minutes – Owen Waller

The January minutes were sent out to the board prior to the meeting. Owen motioned to approve the January general meeting minutes, Jan seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Fire Report – Eric Horn, Cincinnati Fire Dept.

Captain Eric Horn with engine 34 at Clifton and Ludlow presented the monthly fire report. Engine 34 made 205 total runs. 134 of those were EMS, 71 were fire related (note: not all were fires, some just fire alarms). In the Clifton area, Engine 34 made 183 runs, 89 were medic transports. 35% of them were BLS (Basic Life Support), which was less serious runs. 62% were ALS (Advanced Life Support), which is more serious.

Captain Horn mentioned Cincinnati had an uptick in CO (Carbon Monoxide) emergencies. CO is odorless, but it will cause fatigue, headache, dizziness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain, impaired vision, confusion, and eventually can lead to asphyxiation. It especially affects children, older adults, and anybody who has heart conditions or breathing problems.

To alleviate CO risks, get carbon monoxide alarms, warm your vehicle up outside of your garage, do not grill inside your garage, do not run a generator inside, and don't try to use your gas stove to heat your apartment.

Tim Noonan asked if the CFD run breakdown included a subcategory for overdoses. The captain said he would look into it, but explained that increases in overdoses usually occur in surges and there had not been any increase/surge.

Another audience member asked the captain how to help someone who is overdosing. He explained friends of his had revived people with naran before. Those administering naran became a target of irate behavior because they "killed the high" of the person revived. The audience member asked if those administering naran should/should not stay with the person until first responders

arrive. The Captain told him that after administering naran, anyone concerned for their own wellbeing could call 9-1-1 and leave the scene. Emergency services would arrive and provide further care.

Clifton Recreation Center - Brittany Havens

The CRC is hosting a “Youth to Work” initiative for teens aged 14-17, with applications now live. The rec center will host the Mayor’s Career Expo on Saturday, Feb 14, from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m., offering on-the-spot interviews and booths from local businesses, city jobs, and recreation centers.

The Winton Rec Center is also running a “Love of Literacy” book drive aiming to place books in the hands of youth. Brittany explained that new and gently used books can be dropped off at any rec center to help meet an ambitious goal of 5,000 books.

The CRC is launching “Little Explorers,” an 8-week art (Tuesdays) and gym (Wednesdays) series for children 2-4 years old, meeting 12:45pm – 1:45 pm and costing \$20 for an 8-week session. Brittany encouraged residents to reply with feedback about scheduling, as they would like to meet most people’s schedule needs. Lastly, the Buy-Nothing swap returns on April 25 from 10:00am – 12:00pm. Brittany encouraged residents to clean out their homes and bring items for exchange.

Clifton Branch Library update - Jeanne Strauss de Groot

Jeanne opened by announcing the Winter Checkout Challenge, running through February 28. Participants who sign up receive a free tote and a weekly bookmark; completing four of the five bookmark activities earns a mug and entry for a grand prize.

Jeanne also highlighted some upcoming events: Saturday, Feb 7 at 11am – 12pm is the Curious Kids Explorer’s Club with Mr. Eric on the invention of Play-Doh. It will have a demo with hands-on activities, including each child taking home some Play-Doh. Wednesday, Feb 11, 6pm – 7:30pm teams of 4-5 tackle the same 300-piece puzzle in 1½ hours. Anyone can sign up solo or as a group and will be placed on a team.

Treasurer's Report – Bridget Waller-Kent

Bridget explained she officially rolled everything into 2026 and everything is in order. Bridget, Gerald, and Jan are tracking chronicle account transactions for advertising payments, pending transactions, etc.

The finance committee also worked to put a separate Clifton Safety Fund grant page. It will be shown as a dedicated page rather than under "other." It is the amount that was donated and designated for the Clifton Safety Fund because CTM got an additional donation in January and needed a way to track it with more visibility.

Committee Reports

Resignation of Mindi Rich

Before the committee reports, Ben announced that Mindi Rich had resigned from her position as trustee. Thus, openings were announced for Arts & Culture chair, Events Committee Chair, and Clifton Soccer liaison. Specifically, an Events chair is needed badly for the frequent events (Memorial Day Picnic, Holiday's on Ludlow, Clifton Fest, and more) that are hosted and assisted by CTM.

Arts & Culture – *Not currently chaired*

No report this month.

Caretaking/Beautification – Kevin Mohan

No update this month.

Chronicle – Jan Checco

Jan explained that the deadline for the spring issue for advertising and for stories is February 24. She also explained the Chronicle team had been looking at changing their publication and printing to a printer in Maysville, Kentucky.

This would be a more local option than the current printer. The printer's name is Metavia. Jan, Gerald, and the rest of the Chronicle team are still resolving some questions, but it could be a significant savings. The change would be done for the fall issue.

Clifton Plan – Gerald Checco

The Clifton plan will be resuming in March.

Clifton Soccer – Mindi Rich

No report this month.

Communications – Ben Pantoja

Ben plans to upgrade the website by moving it from WordPress to Squarespace, which he said is far easier to post to and maintain. Ben brought up that WordPress became outdated and insecure, and fixing it would cost roughly twice as much as simply switching platforms.

Ben secured two quotes, each promising completion within three to four weeks once funding is obtained. The primary goal is to obtain NSP funds to cover the migration cost.

Events – *Not currently chaired*

In pursuit of a new chair for the Events committee, the responsibility of the events chair was described. The Events committee handles Holiday's on Ludlow, the Memorial Day Picnic & Parade, staffs volunteers for Cliftonfest, and jointly hosts the Welcome & Connect event. Monthly meetings are held and business coordination is done by the Events committee. It is a vital role for the community outreach of CTM.

Golf Outing

No report this month.

Governance – Ben Pantoja

Bylaws adjustment included later on the agenda.

Housing & Zoning – Owen Waller

In the last meeting the H&Z committee made a list of goals and objectives for the year provided by meeting attendees and committee members' emails. Additionally, Ben coordinated with the City to correct the login for the zoning interface website Project Dox.

The next meeting will be a week after the general meeting at 6:00pm. Exact location will be determined on a case-by-case basis and will be reflected on the CTM events calendar on the CTM website: cliftoncommunity.org/calendar

Membership & Nominating – Barry Gee

CTM only has 12 trustees, more trustees are needed to help the board with its responsibilities.

Public Safety – Aaron Weiner

Aaron presented crime statistics organized by the City of Cincinnati and a separate report created by Tim Noonan from the Safety Committee. Both reports will be included below.

Michelle M. asked about the source of the City of Cincinnati's crime statistics. Board members answered that crime stats could be found online, specifically at: <https://insights.cincinnati-oh.gov/stories/s/Reported-Crime/8eaa-xrvz/>

Aaron updated the audience that the break-ins on Ludlow were still being investigated.

Additionally, a resident returned to the board with concerns of a neighbor shooting off a firearm in the air. They had been working with the Safety committee to have CPD knock on the door of their neighbor to address the firearm concern. The response from CPD had not been satisfying, specifically CPD citing the need to mention where the complaint came from to the neighbor with the firearm. The safety committee and the resident are continuing to work through this issue with CPD.

Michele M. mentioned she got a notification that ICE agents were at an apartment on Ludlow avenue. Board members had not yet been notified about this. Another audience member confirmed that there had been reports of ICE agents. Michelle urged the board to take a stance at some point if issues got worse.

Transportation – Bob Seigel

Morgan Rich, the chair of the Transportation Committee, was not present at the meeting. Bob Seigel, the vice chair, gave the update. The committee is still waiting

to hear the city decision on the BRT Station Location. They view our role as educational to the community, being that there's pros and cons to either location.

The speed bump on Clifton Ave at Warren is also going to be worked on in the spring. The transportation committee is changing the monthly meeting date to be the fourth Tuesday of each month.

Welcome & Connect – *Not currently chaired*

No report this month.

Neighborhood Support Program (NSP) Liaison – Barry Gee

Ben brought up that projects were picked for NSP thus far totalling \$9,960, the awarded amount from the city as a part of the NSP program.

Clifton Business Association Liaison – Jan Checco and Aaron Weiner

Jan announced that the Bubble Tea shop on Ludlow Ave would soon be opening. Additionally, Crepe and Dip would be moving into the old Bohemian Hookah bar building.

The CBA is also collecting statistics about who is visiting the business district so they can put together a marketing program.

Off Ludlow Gallery – Mary Pat Lienhart

Sticks and Stones exhibit is being shown at the Off Ludlow Gallery throughout the month of February.

End of Committee Reports

Special Meeting for Clifton-Ludlow BRT Station – Ben Pantoja

Ben announced that a special CTM meeting would be held on February 24th 2026 regarding the Metro BRT (Bus Rapid Transit) Station for the Clifton-Ludlow area. The board and audience discussed the station options. Slides detailing the stations will be included below.

Motion for Clifton Cares Safety Fund to fund cameras for Clifton Plaza – Aaron Weiner

Ben read a motion, attached to the minutes below, to update the goal and financial documentation of the Clifton Cares Safety fund. The motion is to use the \$3000 collected from the “Clifton Cares Safety Fund” on security camera upgrades on the Clifton Plaza. Ben made the motion, Aaron seconded the motion.

Bridget asked Ben to clarify if the camera improvements included the CPD live monitoring hardware. Ben responded no, the cost was too prohibitive (6k-7k per camera).

Owen asked where the updated cameras would be going. Tom Lienhart responded that the cameras would stay in the same position as the current cameras. Two on the street with a wide angle viewing over the whole Clifton Plaza and one on the stage which captures the stairs going to the merchant lot.

Jan asked if this included upgrading the cameras which watch over the Telford benches. Ben answered that those would hopefully get upgraded with the full \$15,000. \$3000 from the Clifton Cares fund, \$6000 from the CBA, and a couple of grant organizations that the Safety Committee expects to get \$5000-\$6000 from. Ben mentioned there are a total of 6 camera locations, and by the time the money is spent all 6 cameras will no longer be going through ADT and will be fully upgraded.

Patrick mentioned that with the current situation with ICE the cameras may be opening a door to something more harmful that would make the community less safe for certain community members. He asked whether money could be spent on anything else that could make the community safer like traffic interventions or the like.

Owen brought up that the wording of the motion “‘digital’ police ‘patrols’” may be far from what residents hoped for when they donated. He cited police-resident relations as an important factor lost when spending money on digital surveillance. Jan mentioned that hiring police for overtime shifts was difficult due to the lack of officers. Ben mentioned he read the original intent as hoping the Police overtime led to stopping crime on Ludlow and pointed out that cameras would be useful in that goal.

The motion passed the motion 7-1 with 1 abstention:

Yes: Jan, Kevin L., Kevin M., Ben, Bob S., Bridget, Aaron,

No: Patrick

Abstained: Owen

Note: Genet had left the meeting by this time and did not vote on the motion.

Future Proposed Bylaws Change – Ben Pantoja

Ben brought up a bylaws change to reduce the board to 13 members from its current 15. Ben read out the bylaws change for discussion.

Gerald brought up that with 13 trustees, the current election cycle with 5 terms expiring every year could not continue. He mentioned that the governance committee should make a path to have the board reach 13 trustees over the next few years, so as to not vote off trustees.

CTM's board has 3 year terms given to 5 individuals each year ensuring 1/3 of the board could change every election. Gerald explained that the bylaws would have to state, somehow, that two out of three elections, only 4 trustees would be elected to maintain 13 trustees.

Owen brought up that he thought the board should not shrink, as the board is always in need of people in case trustees resign- as happened with Mindi this meeting. Aaron inquired if it would be easier if we kept the maximum number of trustees at 15 and add a specified minimum number of trustees. Bridget agreed.

Mary-Pat explained that additional terms (2-year, 1-year) were added to each year's elections to replace any resigned board members' terms and maintain 5 full terms ending every year. Bridget asked Gerald if keeping the number of trustees would cause any issues with tracking trustee terms. Gerald answered no, but if the board were to reduce the number of trustees the devil would be in the details on how it should be implemented.

Ben concluded that the proposed bylaws change would have to go out to the mailing list again after new language was arrived upon. The board then edited the proposed bylaws amendment. The original version that was sent out to the membership is included in the minutes for context and completeness.

Community Questions & Concerns – Ben Pantoja

No public comment was given.

Adjournment - Next CTM Board Meeting 3/2.

Motion to adjourn called by Ben, seconded by Bridget, and was unanimously approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:56.

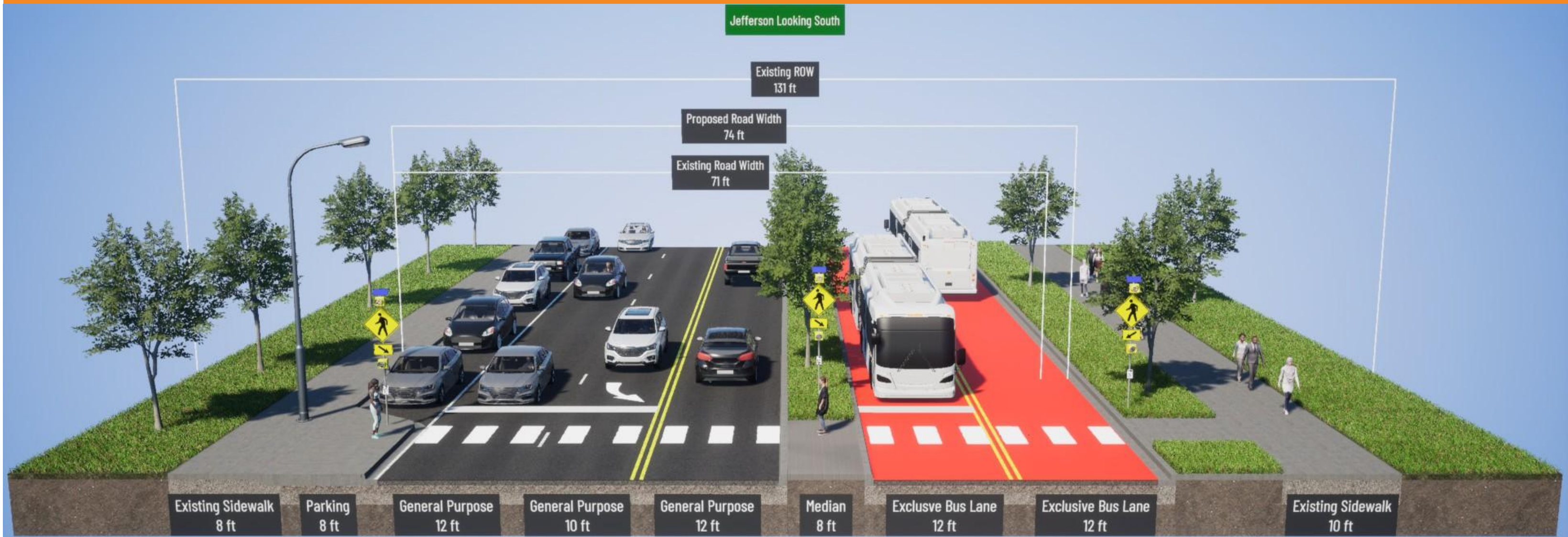

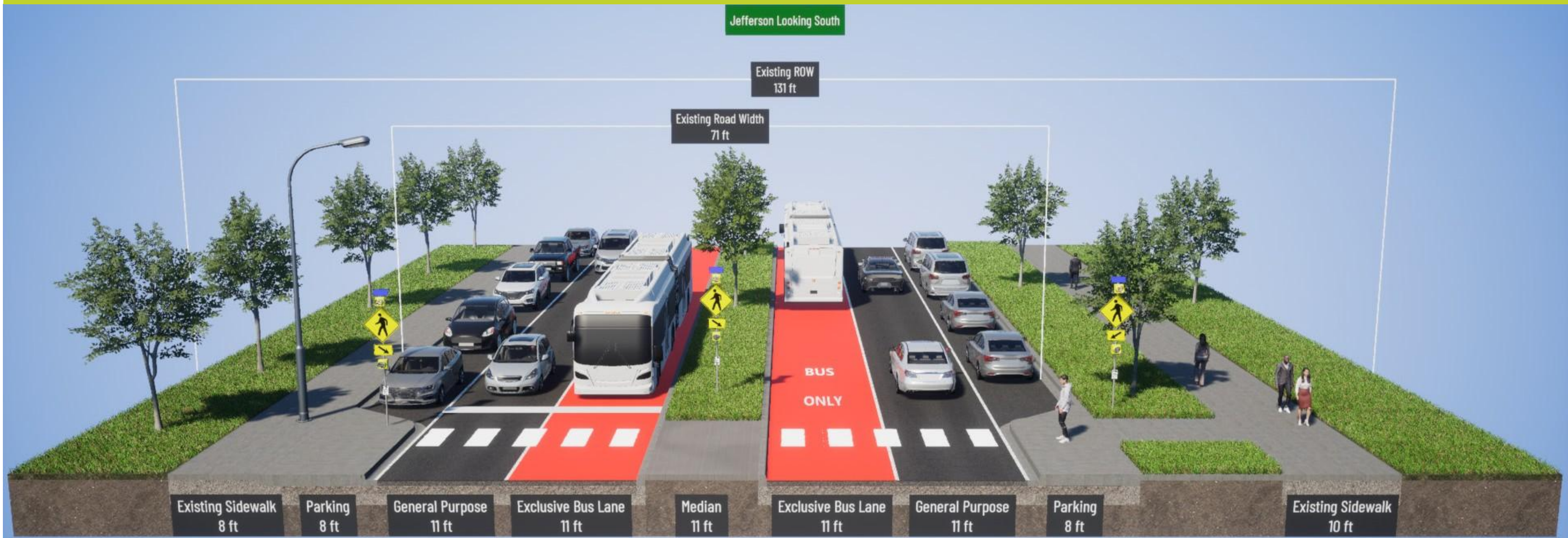

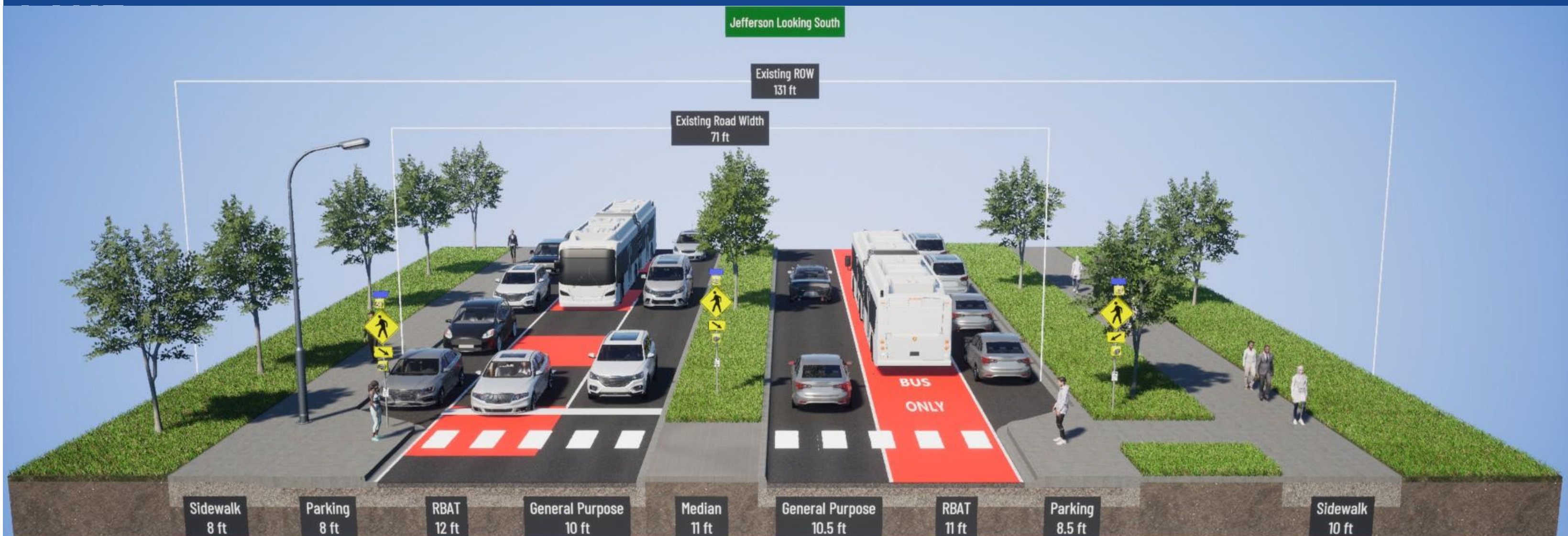

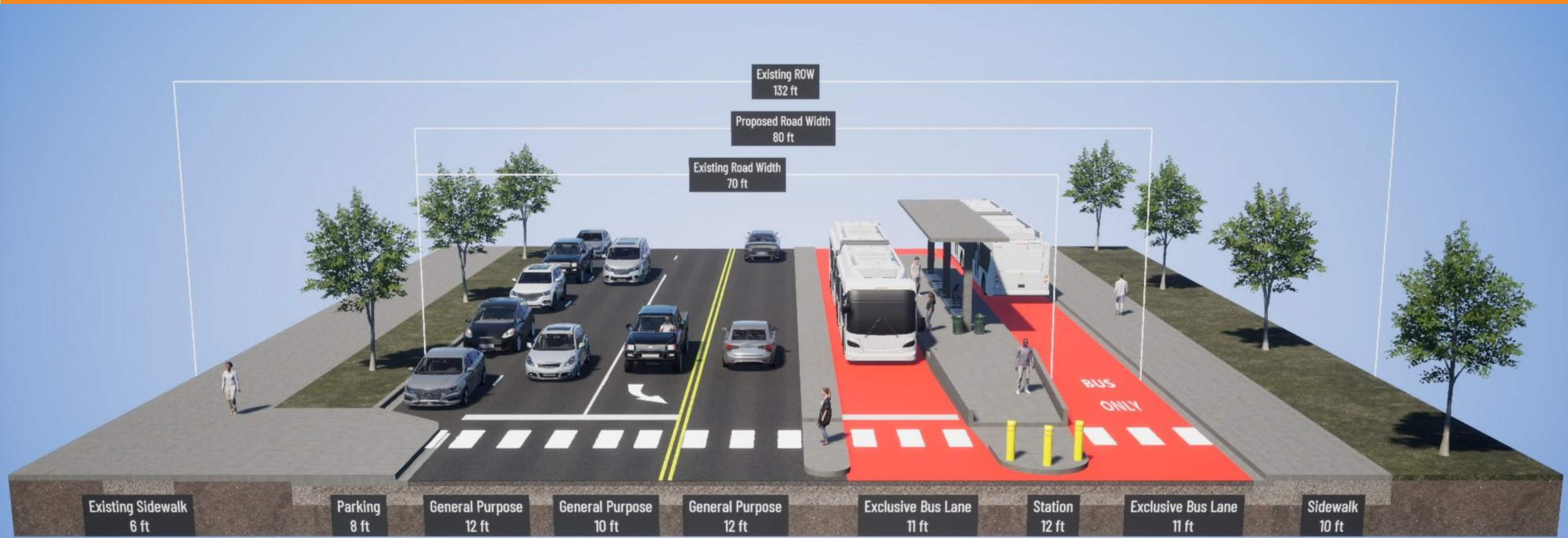

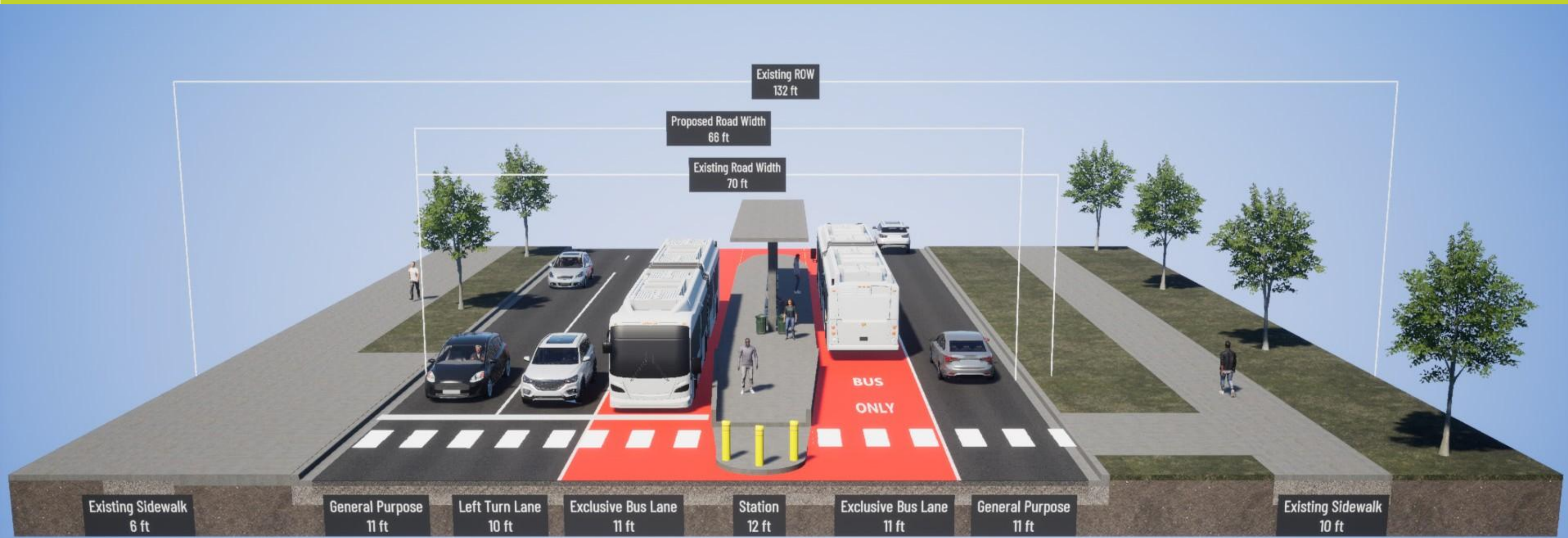

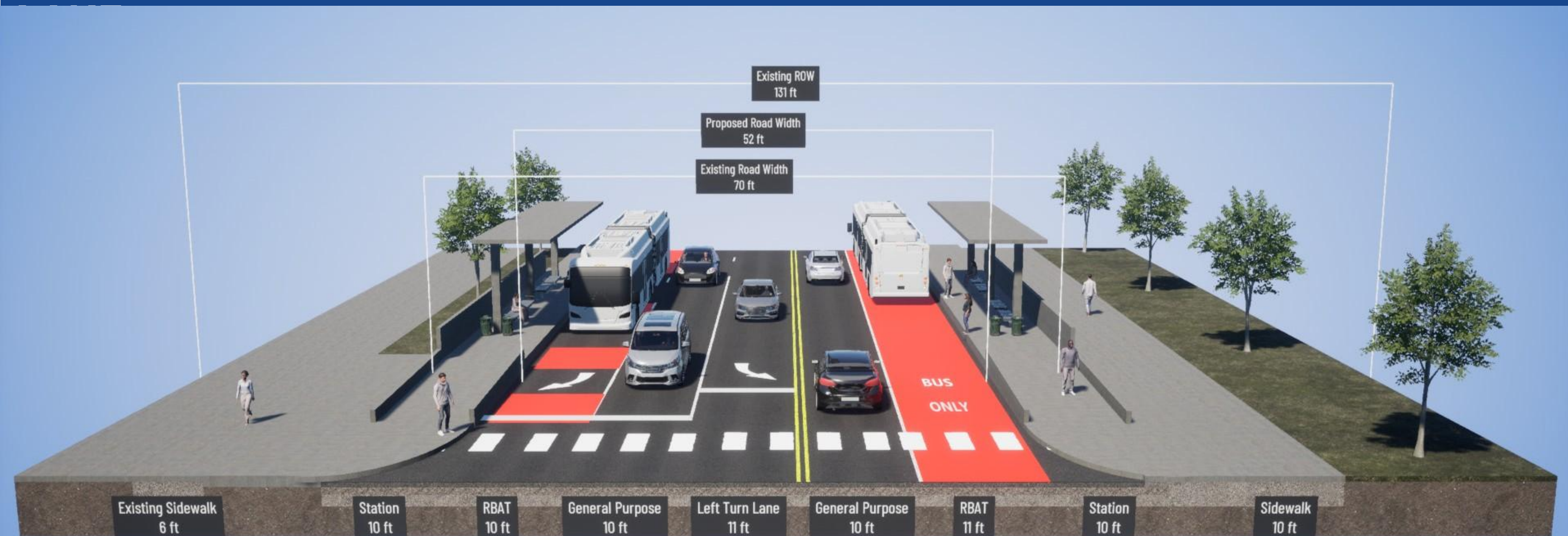

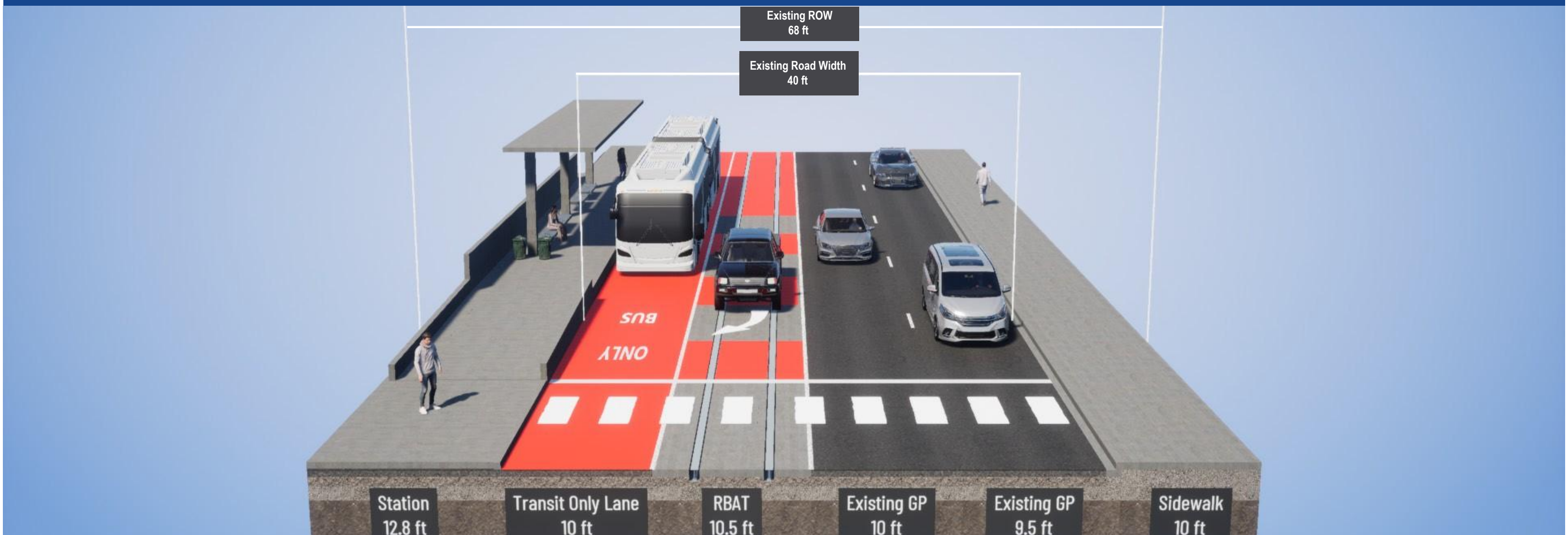

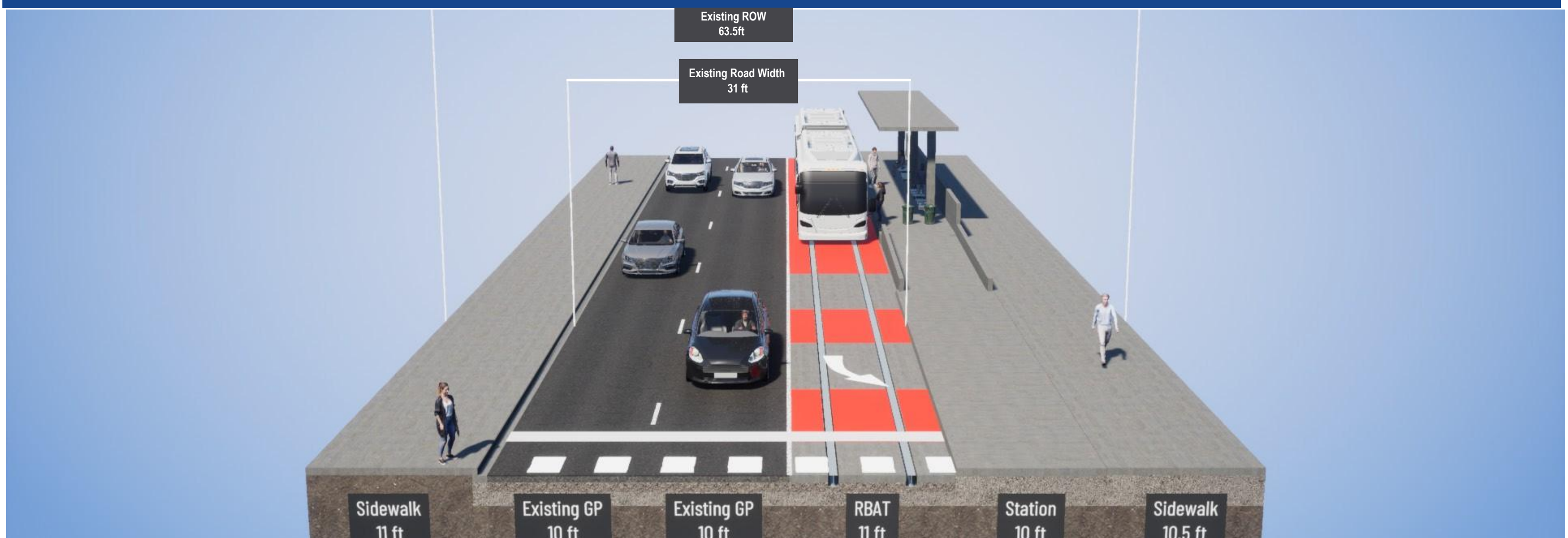

Motion to Update Goal and Financial Documentation for Clifton Cares Safety Fund

Whereas approximately \$3,000 was raised through the “Clifton Cares Safety Fund” to fund extra police patrols on Ludlow Avenue in 2025, and

Whereas this money was not spent in 2025 due to a shortage of police resources and, therefore, the goal of this fundraising effort needs to be amended, and

Whereas this \$3,000 is a liability, similar to a grant, because it is earmarked for a specific purpose and the existing CTM Financial Report does not reference this liability anywhere in the report, and

Whereas video cameras on Ludlow have been providing “digital” police “patrols” on Ludlow that have led to concrete safety results such as an arrest for arson, arrest for kidnapping, restraining orders on an individual who had committed assaults, identifying vehicles involved in hit and run accidents, pressure on the city that led to eventual closing of the Bohemian Hookah Cafe, and progress in investigating 7 break-ins on Ludlow Avenue in December of 2025, and

Whereas the video cameras on Ludlow are outdated, low resolution, and frequently not functioning, and

Whereas the estimated cost of upgrading all the video cameras on Ludlow is \$18,000 and CTM has confidence that other organizations and grants will contribute \$15,000

Therefore, this moves that the goal of the “Clifton Cares 2025 Safety Fund” be amended such that it provides \$3,000 for video cameras on Ludlow. The money will be spent to upgrade the cameras for the Clifton Plaza which is owned jointly by CTM and CBA. Furthermore, this moves that the 2025 Year End Financial Report be amended to show the \$3,000 as a liability in the General account and that 2026 Treasurer Reports include a tab representing the Safety Fund similar to the way grants are represented.

Proposed Bylaws Change for April 6th Meeting

This email provides the required public notice for a future vote on a bylaws change. The vote will be during the 4/6/2026 Board Meeting at 7pm at the Clifton Recreation Center. The bylaws change requires a 2/3 majority of members present. Below is the motion that will be voted on.

2026 Change in Number of Trustees

- Whereas CTM Bylaws requires 15 board members and other Cincinnati Community Councils are believed to have 11 or fewer board members, and
- Whereas CTM often has multiple vacancies because it is difficult to get 15 volunteers to apply for board positions, and
- Whereas CTM rarely has competitive elections, with no more than enough candidates for all the openings and sometimes fewer candidates than all the openings including in 2025, and
- Whereas CTM currently has only been able to fill 13 of the 15 positions,
- Therefore, the following Bylaws amendment is proposed:

Original Wording

ARTICLE V. BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND BOARD MEETINGS

1. Number of Trustees. The management of CTM, its affairs, finances and property shall be entrusted to a Board of 15 Trustees.

2. Election of Trustees. On the date of the annual Board meeting, the members of the organization shall elect five Trustees to fill the vacancies created by the expiration of terms, and the Trustees so elected shall serve for a term of three years, or until their successors are elected and qualified. If for any reason more than five three year terms expire in the same year, the five trustees who receive the most votes will serve three year terms. One year or two year terms will be assigned based on number of votes as needed to return to the intended target of five expiring three year terms per year. The members shall also elect Trustees to fill additional vacancies that arise due to trustees leaving office prior to completion of their three year term. Trustees so elected shall serve the length of the unexpired term. No person shall be elected as Trustee by the general membership for more than two full consecutive terms or six years plus any part of an unexpired term served as a result of appointment by the Board of Trustees.

New Wording

ARTICLE V. BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND BOARD MEETINGS

1. Number of Trustees. The management of CTM, its affairs, finances and property shall be entrusted to a Board of 13 Trustees.

2. Election of Trustees. On the date of the annual Board meeting, the members of the organization shall elect five Trustees to fill the vacancies created by the expiration of terms, and the Trustees so elected shall serve for a term of three years, or until their successors are elected and qualified. If for any reason more than **four** three year terms expire in the same year, the **four** trustees who receive the most votes will serve three year terms. One year or two year terms will be assigned based on number of votes as needed to return to the intended target of **four** expiring three year terms per year. The members shall also elect Trustees to fill additional vacancies that arise due to trustees leaving office prior to completion of their three year term. Trustees so elected shall serve the length of the unexpired term. No person shall be elected as Trustee by the general membership for more than two full consecutive terms or six years plus any part of an unexpired term served as a result of appointment by the Board of Trustees.
