#### Motion to Approve Agenda – Ben Pantoja

The meeting agenda was sent out prior to the meeting. Ben Pantoja motioned to approve the June meeting agenda, Owen seconded the motion. The agenda was approved unanimously.

#### Motion to Approve June Minutes – Owen Waller

The minutes were sent out to board members prior to the meeting. Owen motioned to approve the minutes, Jan seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

#### Fire Report – Cincinnati Fire Dept. (CFD)

No report this month.

#### Clifton Branch Library update - Jeanne Strauss de Groote

No report this month, a comprehensive list of July's Clifton Branch Library events was emailed out with the agenda.

#### **Clifton Recreation Center - David Daniel**

David announced that the Back to School Bash is coming up in August. CRC is seeking partnerships from organizations in arts or STEM for younger students to sponsor the event. Any organizations related to STEM, art, music, culture, sports, etc. are encouraged to reach out to CRC.

#### Treasurer's Report and Motion 1 & 2 - Gerald Checco

The treasurer's report was sent out with the agenda. Additionally, Gerald explained he would be transitioning the treasurer's duties to Bridget Waller and Robert DiMartino later this year.

Gerald explained that motion 1 is to approve an additional \$400 for Off Ludlow Gallery operations, the money will be used to maintain the facebook and social media related to the gallery. Gerald made the motion, Patrick seconded the motion. The motion language is attached at the end of the minutes. The motion was unanimously approved.

Gerald then explained motion 2. The most recent Off Ludlow Gallery exhibit, Art in Action, was a non-profit fundraising exhibit for 15 non-profits around Cincinnati. Motion 2 is to approve the beneficiaries, approve the revenue

allocation for the exhibit, and authorize the treasurer to pay for these expenses. An explanation of the motion details, including all non-profit beneficiaries, is attached to the minutes.

Gerald added he had never seen such a successful exhibition from the Off Ludlow Gallery. Gerald made the motion, Ben seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### **Motion 3 Recognition for Leslie Mooney - Gerald Checco**

Ben presented the letter in Motion 3, Gerald read it aloud. The letter details contributions to Clifton by Leslie Mooney and emphasizes her admirable leadership in Clifton's art and culture scene as she steps down from her position at the CCAC. The full letter is included below as an attachment to the minutes.

Leslie thanked everyone. She emphasized that she plans to continue to stay engaged in Clifton. Further, she explained that the support from the community was integral in building the CCAC and she was very grateful for everyone's support. She hoped to see everyone in October of 2026 at Blink.

#### **Clifton Soccer Report - Josh Lea**

Josh Lea, the president of Clifton Soccer, introduced himself and explained his 10+ year history with the organization as a coach. He emphasized that Clifton soccer was a great way for kids and families in Clifton to connect and get active.

He gave the history of Clifton Soccer, participating in the SAY Soccer league originally founded in Cincinnati in 1967. Clifton soccer hosts recreational soccer for ages 4-18, split up into leagues by age group, and they field 350-400 kids every spring and fall. Josh also mentioned that he would soon be looking for someone to take the torch from him and encouraged anyone very interested in Clifton Soccer to reach out.

#### Public Safety - Steve Goodin

Ben began by presenting videos and images from an incident at the Hookah Cafe that occurred the past weekend. There were 8 arrests, 1 of which was assaulting a police officer.

Sarah Tobias introduced herself. She explained she lives on Ludlow Ave and has been experiencing disturbances for the past few months due to parties outside the Hookah Cafe. She cited the incident from last weekend as a breaking point.

Steve Goodin explained to the board and audience that the Hookah Cafe is legally difficult. The case is of public nuisance and it is difficult to link directly to the cafe in court. He encouraged residents to contemporaneously call in incidents so police can respond and document incidents.

Many audience members and board members discussed issues of understaffed police, possible police details on Ludlow for certain times, the Hookah Cafe's landlord taking action, shutting down parking on Ludlow after certain hours, a theoretical noise monitoring system, and premises liability.

#### **Transportation – Justin Ogilby**

The transportation committee meeting will be held online on July 17th. The meeting will continue to summarize residents' traffic reports.

#### **Treasurer Report – Acting treasurer: Gerald Checco**

The treasurer's report was covered in the agenda.

#### Welcome & Connect – Mindi Rich

No report for this month.

#### **DePaul Cristo Rey Update from Principal - Siobham Taylor**

Siobham is the current president and CEO of DePaul Cristo Ray High School. Formed in 2011, the high school provides a quality education to students who need more resources. They are a part of a larger network of private catholic schools that aim to provide college preparatory education including providing

students with employment during their enrollment. They enroll more than 300 students each year, 92% of which become first generation college students.

DePaul Cristo Rey also supports students and their families through college and ensures students complete their degrees. College graduation rates of alumni are double the national average of their demographics.

Q: Have you had any difficulties with your hispanic students due to what is happening in Washington and kids disappearing?

A: No students have disappeared, however families are feeling the pressure of the political climate. Families have been choosing to move back to their home countries. One student had to leave due to this.

Q: If a business chooses to sponsor a student through DePaul Cristo Rey, what would that look like?

A: Each class is out to work one day of the week. Programs begin after labor day through the first week of May. DePaul Cristo Ray takes care of transportation, lunch, etc.

Q: What kind of volunteer opportunities are there?

A: The easiest way to volunteer is to reach out to Siobham. Opportunities include tutoring, profession-related guest speakers, day to day operational assistance, fundraising, and anything else volunteers could contribute.

Q: What percentage of students graduate high school, and would DePaul consider sponsoring trade-school educations?

A: 100% of students graduate high school and get accepted to college. ~80% or more choose to enroll. Due to the mission of the parent organization, DePaul Cristo Rey sadly cannot provide equivalent services for trade school educations.

Q: How much support does DePaul Cristo Rey guarantee students through college?

A: DePaul Cristo Rey ensures students do not pay more than \$2,000 - \$5,000 out of pocket by seeking out scholarships.

Q: Where does most of the funding for DePaul Cristo Rey come from? A: ~30% of revenue comes from Edchoice scholarships, ~20% comes from the work study program, and the other half is fundraised.

Siobham ended by saying that she believes that the talented students and workers from DePaul Cristo Rey would make waves in Cincinnati's businesses and non-profits, eventually giving back to Cincinnati and building our city's culture.

#### **Clifton Plan Update - Gerald Checco**

Gerald explained the Clifton Plan was making good progress with each subcommittee meeting finalizing certain aspects of the plan. A report will be published in the Fall Chronicle

#### **Motion 4 Letter to DOTE - Justin Ogilby**

Ben presented a letter to be sent to DOTE by Justin. Justin explained that the transportation committee had been collecting safety issues and organizing them by street and intersection. The in-progress safety report is attached to the minutes. The transportation committee aims to send the list and asks them to identify solutions.

Motions 4a and 4b are both attached at the end of the minutes. Motion 4a is to allow Justin to send the letter, contained in motion 4b, after revising it. Gerald motioned to give Justin the ability to finish the letter and send it as described in motion 4a. Jan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Motion 5 Finance Committee Standing Rule - Gerald Checco**

Motion 5 is a standing rule aiming to formalize the structure and outline the responsibilities of the CTM financial committee. The motion language is included in the minutes. Gerald made the motion, Bridget seconded the motion. It was approved unanimously.

#### Burnet Woods eColi Update from MSD - Diana Christy and Scott Bessler

Diana and Scott from MSD came to address concerns about water quality in Burnet Woods. The presentation included information of the watershed of Burnet woods and logistics of combined sewer overflows. Park infrastructure and MSD sewers both present in Burnet woods, a sensor has been set up where overflows occur in the park.

A team at UC published findings of alarming levels of e. coli in standing water in the park. The tested water was puddled ground water rather than a larger body of water, MSD does not have a standard for that case. MSD recently inspected their infrastructure and does not have evidence of any issues. The timeline for a solution is long due to the complexity of the infrastructure and

numerous other pressing issues. MSD is working with the research team and the US EPA to further research the issue, identify risks, and come up with possible solutions in the near term.

Q: Is the storm water coming from Burnet woods and UC?

A: Yes, stormwater is conveyed from both Burnet Woods and areas around UC. Stormwater detention can be a challenge with large watersheds.

Q: Is the watershed only coming from UC north into the park, or from all around the park?

A: The full watershed is drawn on the first slide of the presentation, and the elevation dictates watersheds. It is mainly coming from UC north into the park. Northern areas of the park flow out to other areas.

Most stormwater infrastructure is not MSD. City of Cincinnati's SMU, UC, and private property owners all own infrastructure that flows into MSD sewers.

Q: Why do recreational water standards not apply to Burnet Woods lake/ground water?

A: UC samples were taken from ground water, people are warned to not recreate in flood waters. If similar e. coli levels were found in the lake it would be cause for concern, though Burnet Woods lake is not yet considered a recreational body of water.

Q: Reports of smells have been dated back to 1950's, plans to address sewer overflows seem to keep getting delayed. When will this be addressed?

A: Water treatment as we know it started in 70's with Clean Water Act. City was non-compliant in the 2000s. Combined sewer infrastructure in older cities like Cincinnati lend themselves to overflows, all of which are large issues with long timelines.

Citizen advocacy, like what has happened with researchers at UC and citizen concerns, helps move health risks up in priority. MSD appreciates the work that has been done and is looking into designing possible solutions.

Q: Are there other known overflows in parks? They would be good places to observe the human aspect of overflows.

A: Mt Airy floods often, other parks should be checked.

Q: Burnet Woods has high residential density and rare greenspace. Does population get taken into consideration when determining issue priority? A: The Burnet Woods overflow was not a numbered overflow point in the initial prioritization. Given the capital plan, it is hard to move it up in priority.

An audience member suggested a turbidity sanitation chamber or daylighting the stream. Noted that most solutions would be expensive for Burnet Woods' small watershed. MSD agreed many small solutions could be implemented and they are looking into them. Another audience member asked why parks was not here, and encouraged this conversation to continue at a larger forum with all stakeholders.

Conversations continued further discussing solutions and timelines. MSD is aiming to come back to CTM, CUFNA, and Corryville CC to discuss findings.

#### **Community Concerns - Ben Pantoja**

A resident brought up concerns about an unkept property on McAlpin that had been empty for years. Neighbors began to upkeep it, however there is still a large construction fence and concrete. Gerald exchanged contact information to work on the beautification of the lot and a resolution to the issue.

#### Adjournment - Next CTM Board Meeting 8/4.

The meeting was adjourned on-time at 8:56.

Motion to adjourn called by Jan, seconded by Owen, and was unanimously approved (U).

#### Motion 1:

During the June 2025 meeting of CTM, a motion was approved to adjust the budget for the Off Ludlow Gallery by adding an expense line item for "Social Media" with an initial setup cost of \$400 to support the Gallery's operations. The new motion proposes an additional \$400 for ongoing expenses to manage this system.

#### Motion 2:

The Off Ludlow Gallery (OLG) is a project of CTM. Exhibitions are held several times a year, including curated shows, solo shows, and a holiday boutique. Typically, 70% of art sales go to the artists, while 30% covers gallery expenses. The June 2025 curated show is a non-traditional event titled "Art in Action," which pairs each artist with a non-profit organization. The non-profit organizations benefiting from the show include:

The revenue from the show will be distributed as follows: 45% will be allocated to the artist, 40% will be directed to the non-profit organization, and 15% will cover the gallery's expenses.

- c- authorize the treasurer to create a line item to pay for these expenses.

#### **CTM Financial Committee**

- **Neighborhood Support Program (NSP) Manager**: Plans and tracks the expenses of the City of Cincinnati Grant.
- Representative of the Chronicle Committee: Offers insights into funding needs and expenses specific to the Chronicle's operations.
- Representative of the Off Ludlow Gallery: Addresses financial aspects of the gallery's events, exhibitions, and maintenance.
- Representative of the Golf Outing: Focuses on the financial performance and planning of the annual fundraising event.
- Representative of Clifton Community Fund and Clifton Business Association:
   Included if CTM benefits from grants provided by these organizations.

In addition to the above, other members may include additional CTM Board members with relevant expertise or interest.

#### Responsibilities of the Financial Committee

The committee is tasked with the following responsibilities:

- Budget Recommendations: Collaboratively develops and recommends an annual budget to the President and Treasurer, ensuring alignment with CTM's priorities and financial goals.
- Quarterly Budget Reviews: Meets quarterly to review the year-to-date budget tracking, addressing any variances, and ensuring financial discipline.
- **Income and Expenditure Forecasts**: Regularly forecasts income streams and expenditure patterns to anticipate challenges and identify opportunities for resource optimization.

- **Yearly Review**: The Financial Committee provides a yearly review of finances and creates a report for the annual meeting.
- Tax Preparation: Works with the paid accountant to file taxes for CTM.

The monthly Treasurer reports will serve as the minutes of the Finance Committee meetings.

#### **Overall Purpose**

The Financial Committee plays a crucial role in fostering financial transparency, accountability, and strategic decision-making within CTM. By leveraging the collective expertise of its members, the committee ensures that CTM maintains financial health and continues to achieve its mission effectively.




# It's All About Clean Water

MSD collects and treats wastewater from Greater Cincinnati communities, protecting the environment and public health by returning clean water to local rivers and streams.







- Burnet Woods is subject to flooding and periodic combined sewer overflows (CSOs) during rain events.
- Area in red is the immediately impacted area of the overflow point.
- Overflow point is monitored by a level sensor in the manhole.

- No applicable standard to evaluate risk


